DWS Trades Scholarship Program

Drake-Williams Steel is dedicated to helping youth in the Denver Metro to attend to and succeed in higher education institutions. The purpose of the DWS Trades Scholarship program is to provide scholarships annually to high school seniors with the goal of pursuing a career in the steel industry. The recipient(s) will receive tuition funds to put towards a trades related degree **[ex: Welding, Electro-mechanical Maintenance, Machining, Drafting]** from a local community, or technical college, and an accompanying employment opportunity.

The scholarship award will include:

- 1. \$2,000 value cash award + \$500 for school supplies- payout schedule is detailed below.
- 2. College tuition paid for an approved program **up to \$100/credit hour**. There is no limit on the credit hours per quarter/semester.
- 3. A backpack of DWS gear and new steel-toed boots.
- 4. Required textbooks covered at college bookstore.

Scholarship Program Details:

- 1. Deadline for scholarship applications is **December 6th, 2024, for early graduates** and **March 14th, 2025, by 5 p.m.** for spring graduates.
- 2. Cash payments will be awarded as follows- \$500 for school supplies at start of term + \$500 every 3 months, for employees in good standing, for a total of \$2,000.
- 3. Refer to criteria below for eligibility requirements.
- 4. Submissions should be emailed to scholarship@dwsteel.com and include the application paperwork and any supporting documents needed (i.e. recommendations, evidence of GPA etc.)
- 5. All submissions should be typed.
- 6. The selected student(s) will be notified by phone/email by April 18th, 2025, and will be able to attend a DWS Signing Day event (date TBD) to officially accept the award and physical prizes. (Early graduates are eligible to start the program sooner.)
- 7. Funds for tuition costs will be awarded to the student's institution of attendance upon evidence of registration in classes. This includes the requirement for submission of a proper student identification number and the address of said school's Registrar Office.
- 8. Students <u>must</u> be pursuing a trade- degree [ex: Welding, Electro-mechanical Maintenance, Machining, Drafting].
- 9. Employment with DWS is "at-will."

Criteria and eligibility:

- 1. Applicant must be enrolled at a high school in Colorado.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating senior in the year of the award.
- 3. Applicant must have at least a 2.0 grade point average ("C" average.)
- 4. Applicant must demonstrate community and/or extra-curricular involvement.

- 5. Scholarship recipient must maintain at least Part-Time status of employment at DWS in good standing to continue receiving tuition scholarship funds.
- 6. Scholarship recipient must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in their community or technical college coursework to be eligible for tuition fund sponsorship.
